Thank you for your interest in volunteering for the Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault Victim Advocacy Crisis Line (DVSAVA). The Crisis Line is supported by an alliance of community members dedicated to the prevention of domestic violence; and the safety, transition and healing of victims. DVSAVA partners with representatives from law enforcement, advocacy groups, social agencies, religious groups, counselors, organizations that offer financial & housing resources, survivors of domestic violence , and other local residents that are committed to supporting victims of domestic violence. Our heartfelt appreciation goes out to you for having expressed your desire to help us take a stand against violence in our community.

The DVSAVA Crisis Line provides a single published telephone number that connects victims, concerned community members and law enforcement to a trained victim advocate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Volunteer advocates assist victims throughout Tooele County, either by phone or in person as dictated by the individual in need. Advocates are also trained to provide resources as necessary, and to educate both victims and the public as opportunity arise.

Although not all applicants will be suited to assist directly with victims via the Crisis Line, there are countless opportunities for every person who wishes to get involved.

In addition to the Crisis Line advocates, we are looking for individuals that can help with fundraisers, public awareness, and other projects.
