

ORDINANCE 2002-16

**AN ORDINANCE VACATING MISCELLANEOUS MINOR ROADS
LOCATED IN SECTIONS 11 AND 12, T4S, R6W, SLB&M, ON
PROPERTY OWNED BY THE GRANTSVILLE SOIL
CONSERVATION DISTRICT**

THE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THE COUNTY OF TOOELE ORDAINS

AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I - PURPOSE. It is the purpose of this ordinance to vacate miscellaneous minor roads located east of Mormon Trail Road and within the Grantsville Soil Conservation District's 600 acre parcel in Tooele Valley immediately adjacent to and south of Tooele Army Depot.


SECTION II - FINDINGS OF FACT. Grantsville Soil Conservation District has petitioned the county to vacate the public's interest in all roads existing on the District's property described hereafter, except for the newly dedicated South Mountain Road and the Mormon Trail Road. The roads being vacated hereby no longer serve public purposes. The District's parcel and other parcels adjoining it to the east will continue to be served by the new South Mountain Road. Proper notice of a public hearing was given pursuant to Utah Code Annotated 72-3-108. The planning commission has found there is good cause to vacate these roads and the vacation will not be detrimental to the general interest.

SECTION III - VACATION OF COUNTY ROADS. The county roads in Sections 11 and 12, Township 4 South, Range 6 West, Salt Lake Base and Meridian in Tooele County, Utah, east of Mormon Trail Road are hereby formally vacated pursuant to Section 72-3-108, U.C.A. 1953, as amended. South Mountain Road and Mormon Trail Road are not included within this vacation. A map for reference purposes is attached hereto. The right-of-way and easements, if any, of a property owner and the franchise rights of any public utility shall not be impaired hereby.

SECTION IV - EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective and in force fifteen (15) days after its passage, provided the same has been published prior thereto as provided by law. If this ordinance has not been published within fifteen (15) days after its passage, it shall take effect upon publication.


