

**ORDINANCE 2009-03**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SUBSECTION 7-15.(1), PROFESSIONAL FILMING, OF THE TOOELE COUNTY LAND USE ORDINANCE**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF TOOELE COUNTY, UTAH AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION I - PURPOSE.** This ordinance seeks to eliminate the requirement to obtain a temporary use permit from the County for those doing professional filming in Tooele County on state or federal land where the administrating authority has a filming permit process currently in place. This will eliminate the current "dual" (county and state or federal) permit requirement. The Erda, Pine Canyon, and Tooele County Planning Commissions held public hearings on the issue and recommend passage of this ordinance.

**SECTION II - SUBSECTION AMENDED.** Subsection 7-15.(1), Professional Filming, of the Tooele County Land Use Ordinance, is hereby amended to read as follows:

(1) A temporary conditional use permit shall be required for professional filming to be performed in an area where the primary use is not that of an approved motion picture studio. The permit shall be issued to cover the entire time that film crews are working and may be issued on an annual basis. Exception, a professional filming permit, as identified by this section, is not required if the property is located on state or federal land and the administering authority has a filming permit process already in place. Copies of approved permits and applications may be required to be submitted to the County as proof of proper permitting.

**SECTION III - REPEALER.** Ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.


**SECTION IV - EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall become effective 15 days after its passage provided it has been published, or at such publication date if more than 15 days after passage.

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


