Tooele County Parks and Recreation
Area Management Plan

The following are recommendation for managing the various Recreation and Trails maintained and operated by Tooele County Parks and Recreation. The purpose is to maintain each area in a clean safe manner in an effort to maintain a good relationship with private land owners and public land managers and users. The goal is to provide recreational areas, facilities and maintain public access to public lands and roads.

Settlement Canyon: Seasonal operations April 1, to October 31.

Pre season and Post season clean up and set up. This includes Cleanup Garbage, Trees and Branches, Painting, Clean fire pits, Restroom inspection, Electrical Inspection Repair and replace damaged signs, Inspect and repair fencing and Prepare toll booth for operation or winterize.

Daily operations include:

1. Toll booth operation
2. Clean and Inspect restrooms and pavilion
3. Empty garbage cans
4. Inspect campgrounds
5. Check and remove any potential hazards

Middle Canyon: Seasonal operation closed during the winter no road maintenance

Preseason and Postseason Cleanup

Summer operations include:

1. Tuesday and Thursday inspection and cleanup empty garbage
2. Remove graffiti as needed
3. Canyon inspection and garbage removal weekly by trustees

Grantsville Reservoir Campground: Open year round

April – November Daily inspection and cleaning of restrooms, campground and fire pits

December – March weekly inspection and cleaning

Maintenance of perimeter fence cattle guard and campground done on a continuous basis

Ophir Campground and Trailhead: Seasonal use determined by road accessibility during winter months. Site inspection and cleaning Monday and Friday during seasonal periods. Mid week inspection and garbage removal usually done by the Tooele County Sheriff's trustees.

Stansbury Island: Open year round

By weekly inspection and cleaning

Trail head and Trails: Seasonal use

Clean and inspect restrooms. Inspect and maintain camp grounds

1. Trail Inspections will be done on regular basis to insure all signage is maintained, garbage removed and trail rules are being followed
2. All unauthorized trails and cutoffs will be signed and closed
3. Trail construction and maintenance will be ongoing as needed.
4. Regular trail and recreational use areas will be patrolled and rules enforced by the Tooele County Sheriff, BLM Law enforcement , additional patrols by Tooele County Sheriffs citizen patrol, adopt a trail organizations, Tooele County Parks and Recreation Department and the general public will be encouraged and scheduled
5. Tooele County will enforce camping restriction that no one can camp in one location more than seven consecutive nights
6. Tooele County is dedicated to prosecuting individuals who violate laws and ordinances pertaining to land use issues

7. *Educate recreationist pertaining to rules and regulations by information on kiosks, brochures, signage, and website*

The Tooele County Trails committee in an effort to maintain and enforce trail rules is accepting applications for the adopt a trail program. The committee hopes that through groups and individuals taking ownership in the trail system we can better patrol and maintain the trail system. Access to public and private land is a privilege and it is the intent to help the users understand and care about the stewardship of these resources.
