

**ORDINANCE 2009-14**

**AN ORDINANCE ENACTING SECTION 1-6-4, LOCAL OPTION HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION AND TRANSPORTATION CORRIDOR PRESERVATION FEE, OF THE TOOELE COUNTY CODE, IMPOSING A FEE OF \$10.00 PER VEHICLE REGISTRATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF CORRIDOR PRESERVATION**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF TOOELE COUNTY, UTAH AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION I - PURPOSE.** This ordinance is enacted to generate revenue for the construction, reconstruction, or maintenance of highways within Tooele County.

**SECTION II - SECTION ENACTED.** Section 1-6-4, Local Option Highway Construction and Transportation Corridor Preservation Fee, of the Tooele County Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

**1-6-4. Local Option Highway Construction and Transportation Corridor Preservation Fee.**

(1) The county hereby imposes a local option highway construction and transportation corridor preservation fee of \$10 on each motor vehicle registration within the county.

(2) At the time application is made for registration or renewal of registration of a motor vehicle under this chapter, the applicant shall pay the local option highway construction and transportation corridor preservation fee.

(3) The following are exempt from the fee required under Subsection (1):

(a) a motor vehicle that is exempt from the registration fee under Utah Code Section 41-1a-1209 or Subsection 41-1a-419(3);

(b) a commercial vehicle with an apportioned registration under Utah Code Section 41-1a-301; and

(c) a motor vehicle with a Purple Heart special group license plate issued in accordance with Utah Code Section 41-1a-421.

(4) The revenue generated under this section shall be distributed in accordance with Utah Code Section 41-1a-1222.

(5) The effective date for the fee shall be on July 1, 2009.

**SECTION III - REPEALER.** Ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

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**SECTION IV - EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall become effective 15 days after its passage provided it has been published, or at such publication date if more than 15 days after passage.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF** the Tooele County Commission, which is the legislative body of Tooele County, passed, approved and enacted this ordinance this 7<sup>th</sup> day of April 2009.


