RESOLUTION 2007-02

A RESOLUTION PROPOSING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
THE EAST CIMMARRON SPECIAL SERVICE DISTRICT, TOOELE COUNTY, UTAH

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Tooele County, Utah has determined that the public health, convenience, and necessity require the establishment of the East Cimmarron Special Service District, Tooele County, Utah (the "District") to provide the following services: water including culinary and irrigation, and sewerage, pursuant to the provisions of Article XIV, Section 8 of the Utah Constitution and Section 17A-2-1301, *et seq.* (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, all of the property to be included in the District will be benefited by said District and its provision of the proposed services.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Tooele County, Utah as follows:

1. The public health, convenience, and necessity require the establishment of a special service district.
2. The name of this special service district shall be the East Cimmarron Special Service District, Tooele County, Utah.
3. The proposed boundaries and service area of the District shall include portions of Tooele County, Utah, including the D.R. Davis PUD Amended property located East of State Road-36 at approximately 3520 North (Cimmarron Way), more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 3, TOWNSHIP 3 SOUTH, RANG 4 WEST, SALT LAKE BASE AND MERIDIAN AND RUNNING THENCE NORTH 89°39'05" EAST, ALONG THE NORTHERLY LINE OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SAID SECTION 3, A DISTANCE OF 131.15 FEET TO THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36 AND THE POINT OF BEGINNING FOR THIS DESCRIPTION; THENCE NORTH 89°39'05" EAST, ALONG THE NORTHERLY LINE OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SAID SECTION 3, A DISTANCE OF 908.35 FEET; THENCE SOUTH 00°25'43" EAST, A DISTANCE OF 670.59 FEET; THENCE SOUTH 89°39'05" WEST, A DISTANCE OF 908.49 FEET TO THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36; THENCE NORTH 00°24'59" WEST, ALONG THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36, A DISTANCE OF 139.15 FEET TO THE SOUTHERLY

LINE OF CIMMARRON WAY; THENCE ALONG THE SOUTHERLY, EASTERLY, AND NORTHERLY LINES OF CIMMARRON WAY THE FOLLOWING (5) COURSES: (1) THENCE EAST, A DISTANCE OF 81.75 FEET; (2) THENCE ALONG THE ARC OF A CURVE TO THE RIGHT, WITH A RADIUS OF 25.00 FEET, THROUGH A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 49°40'50", A DISTANCE OF 21.68 FEET TO A POINT OF REVERSE CURVE; (3) THENCE ALONG THE ARC OF A CURVE TO THE LEFT, WITH A RADIUS OF 60.00 FEET, THROUGH A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 279°21'40", A DISTANCE OF 292.55 FEET, TO A POINT OF REVERSE CURVE; (4) THENCE ALONG THE ARC OF A CURVE TO THE RIGHT, WITH A RADIUS OF 25.00 FEET, THROUGH A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 49°40'50", A DISTANCE OF 21.68 FEET; THENCE WEST, A DISTANCE OF 82.19 FEET TO THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36; THENCE NORTH 00°24'59" WEST, ALONG THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36, A DISTANCE OF 471.44 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING. CONTAINS 592,460 SQUARE FEET, 13.601 ACRES.

4. The services to be provided by the District shall be one or more of the following:
 - i. water, including culinary and irrigation
 - ii. sewerage.

5. The Board of County Commissioners of Tooele County, Utah shall hold a public hearing on the proposed creation of the District on June 26, 2007, at 3:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as feasible, at 47 South Main, Tooele, Utah.

6. The Board of County Commissioners directs the County Clerk to cause to be prepared and published the notice of intention in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, to establish a special service district and call the aforementioned public hearing, which notice shall be published once each week during three consecutive weeks with the first publication being not less than 21 days nor more than 35 days before the public hearing, in accordance with the terms of the Act and it direct the County Clerk to also complete the record of proceedings attached as Exhibit B.

ADOPTED, APPROVED, and ORDERED by majority vote at a duly called meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Tooele County, Utah this May 22, 2007.




EXHIBIT A

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ESTABLISH THE
CIMMARRON SPECIAL SERVICE DISTRICT, TOOELE COUNTY, UTAH

NOTICE is hereby given to all interested persons that on May 22, 2007, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Commission") of Tooele County, Utah adopted a resolution declaring that the public health, convenience, and necessity require the establishment of a proposed special service district, to be known as the East Cimmarron Special Service District, Tooele County, Utah (the "District") to provide the following services: water including culinary and irrigation, and sewerage; to properties within the District's boundaries and providing for the holding of a public hearing on the proposed establishment of the District.

In the event the District is created and in the event an election is called and a majority of qualified electors voting at an election grant approval, taxes may be annually levied upon all taxable property within the District. For services provided by the District, such as water or sewer services, charges may be imposed to pay for all or part of the services to be provided by the District.

The boundaries and service area of the District shall include portions of Tooele County, Utah, including the D.R. Davis PUD Amended property located East of State Road-36 at approximately 3520 North (Cimmarron Way), more particularly described as follows:

COMMENCING AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 3, TOWNSHIP 3 SOUTH, RANG 4 WEST, SALT LAKE BASE AND MERIDIAN AND RUNNING THENCE NORTH 89°39'05" EAST, ALONG THE NORTHERLY LINE OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SAID SECTION 3, A DISTANCE OF 131.15 FEET TO THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36 AND THE POINT OF BEGINNING FOR THIS DESCRIPTION; THENCE NORTH 89°39'05" EAST, ALONG THE NORTHERLY LINE OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SAID SECTION 3, A DISTANCE OF 908.35 FEET; THENCE SOUTH 00°25'43" EAST, A DISTANCE OF 670.59 FEET; THENCE SOUTH 89°39'05" WEST, A DISTANCE OF 908.49 FEET TO THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36; THENCE NORTH 00°24'59" WEST, ALONG THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36, A DISTANCE OF 139.15 FEET TO THE SOUTHERLY LINE OF CIMMARRON WAY; THENCE ALONG THE SOUTHERLY, EASTERLY, AND NORTHERLY LINES OF CIMMARRON WAY THE FOLLOWING (5) COURSES: (1) THENCE EAST, A DISTANCE OF 81.75 FEET; (2) THENCE ALONG THE ARC OF A CURVE TO THE RIGHT, WITH A RADIUS OF 25.00 FEET, THROUGH A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 49°40'50", A DISTANCE OF 21.68 FEET TO A POINT OF REVERSE CURVE; (3) THENCE ALONG THE ARC OF A CURVE TO THE LEFT, WITH A RADIUS OF 60.00 FEET, THROUGH A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 279°21'40", A DISTANCE OF 292.55 FEET, TO A POINT OF REVERSE CURVE; (4) THENCE ALONG THE ARC OF A CURVE TO THE RIGHT, WITH A RADIUS OF 25.00 FEET, THROUGH A CENTRAL ANGLE OF 49°40'50", A DISTANCE OF

21.68 FEET; THENCE WEST, A DISTANCE OF 82.19 FEET TO THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36; THENCE NORTH 00°24'59" WEST, ALONG THE EASTERLY LINE OF SR-36, A DISTANCE OF 471.44 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING. CONTAINS 592,460 SQUARE FEET, 13.601 ACRES.

The public hearing shall be held on June 26, 2007, at 3:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as feasible, at the county offices at 47 South Main, Tooele, Utah. Any interested person may protest the establishment of the District either orally at said public hearing, or in a written protest filed with the Tooele County Clerk. All written protests must be filed within 15 days after the conclusion of said public hearing and all withdrawals or cancellations of withdrawals must be filed within 30 days after the conclusion of said public hearing. The Commission will hear all interested persons desiring to be heard and will give full consideration to all protests. If special accommodations are required, please call (435) 843-3150 with reasonable advance notice.

Any written protest made on behalf of a corporation owning property within the proposed District shall be signed by the president, vice president, or any duly authorized agent of the corporation. Where property within the proposed District is owned by more than one person or entity, all owners holding title to the property must join in the signing of the protest in order for it to be considered in the fifty percent (50%) calculation discussed below.

If, within 30 days after the conclusion of said public hearing, more than fifty percent (50%) of the qualified voters of the territory proposed to be included within the District, or the owners of over fifty percent (50%) of the taxable value of the taxable property proposed to be included within the District, file written protests against the establishment of the District, the Commission is required by law to abandon the proposed creation of the District.

After the public hearing and 30-day protest period closes, the Governing Authority shall adopt a resolution either establishing the District, amending the District or abandoning the establishment of the District. A resolution approving the establishment of the District may contain any changes from the initial resolution or this notice of intention the Commission determines to be appropriate, including reduction of boundaries of the District and elimination of one or more of the types of services proposed. The boundaries of the District may not be increased nor additional types of services added, unless the Commission gives a new notice of intention and holds a new public hearing.

Any person who shall have timely filed a written protest and who is a qualified voter residing within, or owning property within, the District, may petition the district court within 30 days after the adoption of said creation resolution for a writ of review. The grounds for such a petition are limited to: (1) a claim that the petitioner's property will not be benefited by the services to be provided by the District; and (2) a claim that the procedures used to establish the District violated the law.

FAILURE TO TIMELY FILE A WRITTEN PROTEST PRECLUDES THE PROTEST FROM BEING INCLUDED IN THE 50% CALCULATION DISCUSSED ABOVE AND THE PROTESTANT FROM FILING A PETITION FOR A WRIT OF REVIEW. FAILURE TO

TIMELY FILE A PETITION FOR WRIT OF REVIEW FORECLOSES ANY RIGHTS TO
THEREAFTER OBJECT TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE DISTRICT.

Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. The time, place and agenda of the meeting had been provided to the Tooele Transcript Bulletin and to each member of the governing body by delivering copies of the notice and agenda at least two days before to each of them.

1. **ROLL CALL.** The clerk called the roll which showed Commissioners Colleen Johnson, Chairman; Bruce Clegg and Jerry Hurst present. Also present were Douglas Hogan, Attorney and Marilyn Gillette, Clerk.
2. **MINUTES.** Commissioner Clegg moved to approve the minutes from the Commission Meeting held May 15, 2007. Commissioner Hurst seconded the motion. All concurred.
3. **INVOICES.** Commissioner Clegg moved to approve warrants issued May 18, 2007 in the amount of \$342,107.96. Warrant #32898 to 33247, Check #1845 to 1856. Transmittal Checks in the amount of \$257,155.60 - Check #1857 to 1871. Commissioner Hurst seconded the motion. All concurred.
4. **DESERET PEAK COMPLEX.** Mark McKendrick, Parks & Recreation, presented bids for remodeling the office and concession building. He would like to go with the Alternate bids one and two instead of the base bids, as follows:

The money for this project is in the Parks & Recreation budget. Commissioner Hurst moved to approve the bid with Child's Enterprise for Alternate 1 and 2. Commissioner Clegg seconded the motion. All concurred.

5. **TOOELE COUNTY DORA (DRUG OFFENDER REFORM ACT) APPLICATION AND LETTERS OF PARTICIPATION.** Doug Thomas, Valley Mental Health,

discussed the DORA with the Commissioners. These are the guidelines for the program, which will be included with the budget sheets, letters of participation from the District Court Judge, County Commission, Adult Probation & Parole and the County Attorney's Office. This is a way for people that have felony charges to get into treatment instead of just being incarcerated. This includes payment for all of the services for the program. They should be able to help between 18 and 25 people. There will be coordination between all of the above mentioned entities. The County Attorney's office will assist in the screening process. Commissioner Clegg moved to approve the Tooele County DORA Guidelines and to implement it within Tooele County. Commissioner Hurst seconded the motion. All concurred.

6. **ORDINANCE 2007-15 - REDISTRICTING TOOELE COUNTY VOTING PRECINCTS AND REAPPORTIONING TOOELE COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD DISTRICT BOUNDARIES.** Marilyn Gillette, Clerk, stated that by state law voting precincts can have no more than 1,250 voters in them. A number of precincts within Tooele County are exceeding, or coming close to that number. She asked that the Commission approve the redistricting that the Clerk's Office has requested. Commissioner Hurst moved to approve Ordinance 2007-15 - Redistricting Tooele County Voting Precincts. Commissioner Clegg seconded the motion. All concurred.
7. **TOOELE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT/TOOELE COUNTY/LEUCADIA LAND EXCHANGE - WAIVER OF ROLL BACK TAXES.** Commissioner Hurst moved to approve the Tooele County School District/Tooele County/Leucadia Land Exchange - Waiver of Roll Back Taxes, that the roll back taxes of \$1,504.24 be paid. Commissioner Clegg seconded the motion. All concurred.
8. **RESOLUTION 2007-02 - PROPOSING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CIMMARRON SPECIAL SERVICE DISTRICT, TOOELE COUNTY, UTAH.** Eric Johnson, with whom???, discussed this with the Commission. This district has been proposed by Dave Davis, who lives in the area. He will transfer his septic system into the district once it is established. This starts the ball rolling with the Public Hearing scheduled for June 26, 2007. Valerie Lee, Treasurer, asked whether it was just on the east side of SR36. Mr. Johnson stated that it is. Commissioner Clegg suggested calling it the East Cimmarron Special Service District since it is only on the east side of the road. Mr. Johnson will make modification to the notice.

Commissioner Hurst moved to approve Resolution 2007-02 - Proposing the Establishment of the East Cimmarron Special Service District, Tooele County, Utah. Commissioner Clegg seconded the motion. All concurred.

10. **CONTRACT REVIEW.** A) 06-05-01 - Jail Commissary Services Agreement, Tooele County and Keefe Commissary Network and B) 06-05-04 - Consent for EPA Access to County Property at the Jacobs Smelter Site, Tooele County and US Environmental Protection Agency will be reviewed in June, 2008; C) 06-08-08 - Bailiff Services, Tooele County Administration Office of the Courts - State of Utah and D) 06-08-09 - Juvenile Bailiff Services, Tooele County and Administration Office of the Courts - State

of Utah will be reviewed August, 2007.

11. **BOARD APPOINTMENTS.** Commissioner Johnson moved to appoint the following people to the Department of Workforce Services Central Region Council: Scott Snelson, Salt Lake/Tooele Applied Technology College, Term - January 2007 - June 2011 and Rebecca Downs, Mountain America Credit Union, Term - March 2007 - June 2011 and to reappoint Charles Daud, C.D. Accounting & Tax Services, Term June 2007 - June 2011, Nancy Malecker, UTA Trans Authority, June 2007 - June 2011, Kevin Schofield, UT Alliance of gov. employees, Term June 2007 - June 2011 and Karen silver, SL Community Action Program, Term June 2007 - June 2011. Commissioner Hurst seconded the motion. All concurred.

12. **TAX ADJUSTMENTS.** Treasurer Lee discussed the tax adjustments with the Commission. Commissioner Clegg moved to approve the following tax adjustment's/deferral's: A) George W. Smith, Serial #98-000-0-0241. Tax year adjustment 2004 - \$123.66, 2003 - \$14.12, 2002 - \$14.78 and 2001 - \$15.94; B) Sharon N. Putnik, Parcel #10-045-0-0020 and #09-010-0-0003. The total amount to be deferred is \$7,662.20. She will pay \$2,500 immediately and the balance on or before June 8, 2007; C) Karen Johnson Parks, Parcel #01-073-0-0043. The total amount due is \$5,947.24. She will pay \$1,500 by the end of May and will need six months to pay the balance. Commissioner Hurst seconded the motion. All concurred.

13. **ADJOURN.** Commissioner Hurst moved to adjourn the meeting at 3:27 p.m. Commissioner Clegg seconded the motion.

Tooele #15 has been split and some voters moved to Tooele #16
Tooele #18 has been split and some voters moved to Tooele #19
Grantsville #3 has been split and some voters moved to Grantsville #5
Erda has been split in to 30.1 and 30.2
Dugway has been split into 36.1 and 36.2
Stansbury Park has gone from 3 precincts to 5*

Upcoming Elections. 2007 is a Municipal Election year. With the new legislation there have been a few changes in the election laws. Filing to run for a municipal office will be July 1st through July 15th, 2007. The Primary Election will be held September 11, 2007.

Rather than the November Election just being a Municipal Election, Governor Huntsman has made the decision that the school voucher question will be on the November Election ballot, therefore, the November 6th Election will be a county wide election.

Don't relax too soon, the Western States President Primary Election will be held February 5th, 2008, to be followed closely by the regular Primary Election in June, 2008 and the Presidential Election/General Election, November 2008.




